John 4:43-54

Lesson Objective:

By the end of this lesson, students will understand the story of Jesus healing an official's son, recognize the power of Jesus' healing, and learn to trust in Jesus' ability to heal.





JESUS HEALS AN OFFICIAL'S SON "FAITH IN ACTION: JESUS' HEALING TOUCH IN CAPERNAUM"

Lesson Objective: To understand the story of Jesus healing an official's son, recognize the power of Jesus' healing, and learn to trust in Jesus' ability to heal.

Materials needed for Bible Object Lesson:

1 Toy or figurine representing the official's son (can be a small action figure, stuffed animal, or any suitable object)

Teacher Information:

Teacher: Now, let's dive into our Bible lesson. Open your Bibles to John 4:43-54. This is the story of Jesus healing an official's son.

- 1. Read the passage aloud or ask a student to read it.
- 2.Use visual aids or draw pictures on the whiteboard or chalkboard to help illustrate the story.

Bible Lesson Skit

Title: The Miracle of Healing

Characters:

- Professor Goofus
- Lab Tech Lily

Setting: A science laboratory with lab equipment and a lab rat cage.

(Scene begins with Professor Goofus hunched over a lab table, studying his lab rat.)

Professor Goofus: (frustrated) Oh, these lab rats! They're constantly getting sick, and it's driving me crazy. I need to find a way to cure this rat's fever. I wish I could just speak the fever away, like Jesus healed the official's son.

(Lab Tech Lily enters the scene, observing Professor Goofus with curiosity.)

Lab Tech Lily: Professor Goofus, I understand your frustration, but only God and Jesus can perform miracles like that. However, I can show you something related to healing and the story of Jesus healing the official's son. It's a scientific concept called capillary action.

Professor Goofus: (curious) Capillary action? I've heard of it, but how does it relate to healing?

Lab Tech Lily: Capillary action is the ability of liquids to move through narrow spaces, like the way water moves through a paper towel. This concept can help us understand how Jesus' healing power reached the official's son, even from a distance.

Professor Goofus: (intrigued) Oh, I see. Please, explain it to me.

(Lab Tech Lily brings out a clear plastic cup, water, food coloring, and a paper towel.)

Lab Tech Lily: Watch closely. I'll demonstrate capillary action with this experiment.





(Lab Tech Lily pours colored water into the cup and dips one end of the paper towel into the water.)

Lab Tech Lily: Notice how the water starts traveling up the paper towel, defying gravity. This is similar to how Jesus' healing power reached the official's son, bringing healing to him even when Jesus was physically distant.

Professor Goofus: (amazed) That's incredible! I never thought about it that way. The power of healing can extend beyond what we can see or comprehend.

Lab Tech Lily: Exactly! It reminds us that even though we can't perform miracles like Jesus, we can still understand and appreciate the scientific principles behind them.

Professor Goofus: (reflecting) You're right, Lab Tech Lily. I may not be able to speak the fever away, but I can still use my knowledge and apply proper medical treatments to help this lab rat.

(Lab Tech Lily hands Professor Goofus some medication.)

Lab Tech Lily: Here are the medications we can use to help this rat recover. And let's not forget the power of prayer. We can pray for the rat's healing as well.

(They administer the medication and join hands in prayer.)

Professor Goofus: (praying) Dear God, we thank you for the knowledge and understanding you've given us. We ask for your healing touch upon this lab rat. May it recover and be in good health. Amen.

(Scene ends with Professor Goofus and Lab Tech Lily looking at the lab rat with hope and faith.)

CAPILLARY ACTION EXPERIMENT

Lesson Objective: To learn about capillary action and how it relates to the story of Jesus healing an official's son, recognizing the power of Jesus' healing and the hope it brings.

Materials needed for the Science Lesson:

- Clear plastic cups
- Water
- Food coloring
- Paper towels
- Droppers or pipettes





Teacher Information:

FAITH SHIELD CRAFT

- 8. Discuss the importance of healing and how Jesus has the power to bring healing into our lives.





Teacher: For your take-home activity, I encourage you to use your faith shields and keep them as a reminder to trust in Jesus' healing power. You can also share the story of Jesus healing an official's son with your family or friends and discuss how faith played a significant role in this miraculous event.

Remember, Jesus has the power to heal, and we can always turn to Him in faith.
