Parent Bible Lesson 2: "The Power of Water: Noah's Ark"

- Genesis 6:17: "I am going to bring floodwaters on the earth to destroy all life under the heavens, every creature that has the breath of life in it. Everything on earth will perish."

Objective: To teach children about Noah's Ark and the power of water as a force of both destruction and restoration.

Materials:

- A small toy boat or paper boat
- A container of water

Scientific Object Lesson: Place the toy boat or paper boat in the container of water. Discuss with your child how water can be both gentle and powerful. Relate this to the story of Noah's Ark, where God used water to cleanse and renew the earth.



Script:

Parent: "Today, we're going to talk about the power of water and how it played a significant role in the story of Noah's Ark. Water can be gentle, like when it quenches our thirst or helps plants grow. But it can also be powerful, like when it rained for 40 days and 40 nights, flooding the earth."

Child: "That's a lot of water!"

Parent: "Yes, it was. But through that powerful water, God cleansed the earth and brought restoration. Just like the water in Noah's time, we can trust in God's power to restore and bring new beginnings. Let's remember to respect the power of water and be grateful for its many blessings."

Here are daily biblical questions for each day of the week for the lesson "The Power of Water: Noah's Ark":

Day 2:
